INTERNATIONAL PRIZES

PROMOTING ARCHITECTURE TO CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE



The UIA *Architecture and children* work programme announces the launch of a series of international prizes called the UIA Architecture & children Golden Cube awards. In this way the programme hopes to encourage initiatives that sensitise young people and children regarding architecture, the city and sustainable development.

This is not a prize for which participants will develop specific projects or propositions. The Golden Cubes Awards will recognise activities or events realised between 1st January 2007 and 15 March 2011. The prizes will be distributed in three categories: schools (directors, teachers, students), institutions (associations, foundations, museums), and media (publications, audiovisuals).

The judging for these prizes will be carried out in **two phases**. The first will beoperated by the **UIA Member Sections** that will select their candidate for each category. In the second phase an **international jury** will choose the winners from among the Member Sections' propositions. The results will be presented during the UIA Tokyo congress (26 - 29 September 2011).
