
the set of workshops will explore the conditions of publicness and INTERaction of spaces in and around the KNOT. the workshops starts with the hypothesis that top down urban planning methods, aiming to achieve a determined project through an abstract process of planning and internal discussion, aiming to pre define possible futures, do not work in many situations. if we understand the city as a dynamic entity, we could read it with the analogy of a living being, and life does not generally follow planned routes, but is rather good for surprises and detours. looking for a less dterministic, but more dynamic approach to architecture, we need to find ways of integrating learning and testing situations into the design and planning processes. working with 1:1 actions and interventions allows to get in touch with the real conditions of a place.

casual fridays

Tor Lindstrand | economy (stockholm)

There is something with how mascots transform space, how becoming a thing shifts our notion of space. How masquerades, carnivals and streetwear transforms public space. A hands-on investigation about 1920's Eccentrism, Black Mountain College, Picasso, Le Corbusier and Josephine Baker. A workshop about becoming a building and about tracing the territory when costume becomes architecture. Casual Friday is a workshop that dresses up addressing concepts of costumes situated between architecture and performance. Five days about production of "things" and situations - projection and containment. From underwear to public space - a series of site specific productions laid out as grid where street and wear is perpendicular to lo-fi cardboard, blow dryer, glue gun fashion. Economy (Tor Lindstrand) will remix architecture with sweatshop together with all participants to create a compilation celebrating haute couture, striptease, down dressing and facades.

Christoph Schmidt | IFAU (berlin)

"Set a section through the building - every space you cut will be public"

we would like to approach a functionally/programmatically problematic building (space) by exploring its structure pragmatically, based on the thesis that any program fits anywhere. We would like to question the existing structure by investigating on different modes of use, appropriation and adaption. In this way the accomodation of new or unconventional functions, be it a theatre, a restaurant, offices, a museum or residential units will be a matter of inhabitation rather than specialisation. Suboptimal spaces and stimulating complications will define the starting points to develop an architectural debate.

In this phase it is not about defining a new programme for a building (space) but rather to foster a debate about the existing use and possible forms of use of a building (space).

Is there any possibility to open a building, to improve or to complicate its accessibility by conceiving an open building?
