The UIA traditionally discerns a series of prestigious prizes on the occasion of its triennial congresses: the UIA Gold Medal and four UIA Prizes named after Sir Patrick Abercrombie, Auguste Perret, Jean Tschumi and Sir Robert Matthew. Since 2008, the Vassilis Sgoutas prize has been added to this list. Candidatures for the 2011 session are now open and all the UIA Member Sections and Council members are encouraged to submit their suggestions.

The UIA gold Medal and Prizes will be presented at the 24th UIA congress in Tokyo, during a ceremony on 27 September 2011.

#### **DAVID CHIPPERFIELD 2011 RIBA GOLD MEDAL**

The Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) awarded its 2011 Gold Medal to David Chipperfield for his career contribution to architecture. RIBA President Ruth Reed honoured him with these words, "David is one of the world's greatest architects with a portfolio of work that is international in influence. His architecture is one of calm rational elegance, he is a craftsman of delightful spaces and beautiful detailed buildings, and has carved out a career which is an inspiration to anyone seeking to work outside the boundaries of their home country." This recognition follows quickly after his receiving the 2010 Crown Estate Conservation Award, given to commend an exemplary restoration project. David Chipperfield received this award for the Neues Museum Berlin, designed in 1841 by Friedrich Stüler.

#### ZAHA HADID, 2010 RIBA STIRLING PRIZE FOR THE ROME MAXXI



Rome's national museum of 21st century art owes its author, Zaha Hadid, its recognition as winner of the 2010 Stirling Prize chosen jointly by the RIBA, the Architects' Journal and Benchmark. Inaugurated last May, the museum is located in Rome's Flaminio district. Covering 27 000 sq. m. its two sections are dedicated respectively to fine arts and architecture.

The museum is a mature architectural work, resulting from long years of experimentation, of which only a fraction was realised. It is the quintessence of Zaha's continuous search to create a landscape. Here it is a series of cavities along an itinerary drawn in a free, seemingly random line that gives visitors an impression of exploration. The museum is clearly the major realisation in Zaha Hadid's career to date.
