SOLIDARITY AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The UIA Council, meeting in Singapore last 5 & 6 June, reiterated its continued support for the Tokyo congress Organising Committee. The UIA Tokyo congress will take place as planned on 25 - 28 September 2011, on the revised theme **Design 2050: Beyond disasters, through solidarity, toward sustainability**. The UIA general assembly will be held on 29 September - 1st October 2011. United in a single movement to support people and regions suffering from disasters, **architects and the UIA will make responsible and sustainable propositions for the present and the future, in the global context.**

IDEAS FOR THE FUTURE

Four new ideas competitions are proposed as part of preparations for the UIA congress. Each is directed to a specific category of participant: architects, students, and young people. These competitions will enrich the congress' programme of debates and several winners will be invited to present their projects at the congress. The briefs for these competitions are: **designing our children's future with wisdom and dreams; creating a modern-age house in the wilderness; predicting the face of glass architecture in 2050; and LED incorporated lighting - the light of the future and of hope.**

ARCHITECTURAL TOURS IN TOKYO AND AROUND JAPAN

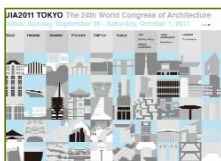

REGISTRATIONS

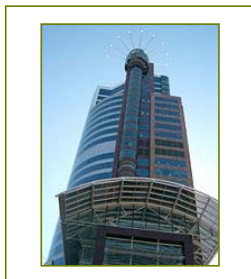
