

UHA PRIZES



In December 2011, the Croatian Association of Architects (UHA), met in Vikovar and presented its annual prizes in presence of the city's mayor, Zeljko Szabo, and UHA president Hrabak Hrvoje. The Viktor Kovacic prize was awarded to professor Ivan Crnkovic for his career work. The Viktor Kovacic prize for the best-built structure recognised the Lone Hotel in Rovinj, realised by 3LHD architects. The Neven Segvic prize for criticism and theory in architecture and urban planning was awarded to the book by Marina Bagaric about architect Ignjat Fischer. The Bernardo Bernard award for interior architecture recognised Alenka Gacic Pojatina, Branko Petkovic, Ana Vlahovic & Morana Krstulovic for Lauba House in Zagreb, and Laube Letilović, Iva Letilović & Igor Pedišić for a temporary exhibition hall in Zadar. The Drago Galic prize for residential architecture in 2011 was awarded to Tomislav Curkovic and Zoran Zidarić for a residence in Bijaći, Bosnia-Herzegovina.

SIX INNOVATIVE PRACTICES FOR THE VENICE BIENNALE



Six examples of innovation in Australian architecture were selected for exhibition at the Venice biennale (29 August – 25 November 2012). Presented by the Australian Institute of Architects and created by Anthony Burke, Gerard Reinmuth and TOKO Design Concept, the exhibition Formations: New Practices in Australian Architecture aims to provoke debate about the changing role of architects and the 'formations' in which they practice. The selected projects range from engagement with humanitarian causes to the creation of specialised technology and education networks for advanced material cultures, but they all showcase the wealth of innovation in Australia's architectural community. Among the formations presented is Healthabitat, designed by Paul Pholeros, Stephan Rainow and Paul Torzillo to improve the sanitary conditions of indigenous populations in Australia, and winner of the 2008 UIA – Vassilis Sgoutas Prize.
