JUNIOR ARCHITECTURE OLYMPIAD



Every year since 2005, the Federation of Institutes of Korean Architects (FIKA) has organised the International Architecture Olympiad in partnership with Hanyang University's school of architecture and engineering (HYU, Republic of Korea), and the National University of Singapore (NUS).

The Olympiad is a confrontation of projects by high school students from both countries, on a single theme revealed to them the day of the competition. It aims to highlight the emerging talent of future architects, their aspirations and creativity. The 8th edition will take place on 14 April 2012. Since its creation, this programme has been supported by the International Union of Architects.

2012 PRITZKER PRIZE

CONGRATULATIONS WANG SHU!

At 48, Wang Shu has become the **first Chinese architect** to receive the prestigious **Pritzker Prize**. Within their Amateur Architecture Studio, he and his wife Lu Wenyo develop an architectural form that is **sustainable**, **humanist**, **and respects the environment**. He advocates a '**slow build**' method while the rest of China is engulfed in frenetic construction; and has been known to recuperate materials from demolition sites to reuse them in modern interpretations, supported by traditional building arts. **Wang Shu enthralled the audience during a round table on sustainable architecture during the UIA congress in Tokyo**.

HENEGHAN & PENG TO REPRESENT IRELAND AT THE VENICE BIENNALE



Elizabeth Francis and John McLaughlin were named commissioners of the Irish exhibition at the 2012 Venice Architecture Biennial (29 August - 25 November). Following a vast consultation, the realisations of Heneghan Peng were selected to represent Ireland, because they are "a perfect illustration of a new form of architecture and a new structure for international professional networks". This Irish office has won two high-profile, international architecture competitions approved by the UIA: the Grand Egyptian Museum in Cairo, in 2003, and the visitor's centre for Giant's Causeway in Ireland in 2005.

DAVID CHIPPERFIELD COMMISSIONER OF THE VENICE ARCHITECTURE BIENNALE

The 13th Venice international biennial of architecture will take place from 29 August to 25 November 2012. Forty-one countries will participate in this year's biennial, for which British architect David Chipperfield will serve as commissioner, along with Italian cinema critic Alberto Barbera. David Chipperfield chose this year's theme: Common ground, because he wants this biennale "to celebrate a vital, interconnected architectural culture, and pose questions about the intellectual and physical territories that it shares. ... This theme is a deliberate act of resistance towards the image of architecture propagated in much of today's media of projects springing fully formed from the minds of individual talents. I wish to promote the fact that architecture is internally connected, intellectually and practically, sharing common concerns, influences and intentions."
