ESA MOHAMED AND THOMAS VONIER - UIA 1st AND 2nd VICE-PRESIDENTS




Meeting in Manila on 19 & 20 April, 2012, hosted by the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP), the UIA Council confirmed the nominations of Esa Mohamed as first Vice-President and Thomas Vonier as second Vice-President of UIA for this triennial period. Council further approved the candidature of **Carlos Alvarez Guzman** proposed by Costa Rica as UIA Council member for Region III-the Americas.

PUBLIC LIBRARY IN GOSAN KOREA

Of an overall floor area of 3 100 m², this cultural centre will have an educational focus but will also offer social and recreational activities The competition is organised with the support of the International Union of Architects UIA. The deadline for registration is 30 July 2012; Projects must no later than 10 September 2012.

WINNERS OF THE 2012 BLUE AWARD

From among the 232 projects submitted this year, the jury for the Blue Award, which showcases responsible architectural design, selected 11 projects from 8 countries to receive 3 prizes, 2 special prizes and 3 mentions. The three prizes were awarded to: Nikhil Chaudhary (CEPT University, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, India), Gregor Fasching (Technical University of Vienna, Austria), and Veronika Holczer (Budapest University of Technology and Economics, Hungary). The Blue Award is organised every two years by the sustainable spatial design department at the Technical University of Vienna, to highlight responsible architectural designs resolutely turned toward the future.

Eyup Muhcu was re-elected president of the **Turkish Chamber of Architects** (CAT) during the CAT general assembly on 13 May, 2012. He is a graduate from the Black Sea Technical University and is in private practice in Istanbul. He contributed to the Chamber's activities as a board member, as secretary general, and then as president of the Istanbul branch of CAT from 2002 - 2010. His current work is dedicated to earthquake risk prevention and reduction, to architectural heritage conservation, urban planning and the legal aspects of the profession.

In closing its general assembly, CAT published a declaration stating its concern and opposition to the new planning and building regulations proposed by the authorities, most notably in relation to the risk of earthquakes.

AIA CALLS FOR EASING STUDENT DEBT IN EXCHANGE FOR PRO BONO ARCHITECTURAL WORK



The American Institute of Architects and the American Institute of Architecture Students called on Congress to approve a law that would alleviate student loan debt for graduates in architecture in exchange for pro bono work for disadvantaged communities. In support for this initiative, AIA President Jeff Potter pointed out that: "there are numerous opportunities for young, talented architects to use their skills to help rebuild our nation's communities. Yet, more and more, young architects are leaving the profession because they cannot afford to remain; this brain-drain will have major implications for our communities and the construction industry in the years ahead."
