CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Vorld Monuments Fund (WMF) invites nominations for the 2012 World Monuments Fund/Knoll Modernism Prize, which will be awarded this fall to a design professional or firm in recognition of innovative design solutions that preserved or saved a modern landmark at risk. The biennial prize was established to raise public awareness of the contribution modernism makes to contemporary life, the important place modernism holds in the architectural record, and the influential role that architects and designers play in preserving modern heritage.

Projects that enhanced a site's architectural, functional, economic, and environmental sustainability while also benefiting the community are encouraged. Nominated projects must have been completed in the last five years.

THE PRIZE

- A cash honorarium of \$10,000
- A Knoll[®] Barcelona[®] chair
- Round-trip airfare and hotel accommodations in New York City to attend an awards dinner and present the project at a lecture at The Museum of Modern Art
- Media promotion of the winning project by the WMF Communications Department

NOMINATION MATERIALS

- A narrative description (up to 500 words) of the preservation project and the modern landmark's significance
- Six photos of the modern landmark (three before and three following completion of the project)
- Name and contact information for the nominator
- Name and contact information for the nominated design professional or firm
- Other relevant information (news articles, reviews, etc.)

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SUBMISSION OF NOMINATIONS

Submissions should be made to **modernism2012@wmf.org**. There is no application fee.

DEADLINE

The deadline for nominations is August 21, 2012.

SELECTION PROCESS

An independent jury of architectural scholars, conservators, and professionals in related fields will select the prizewinner. The jury is chaired by Barry Bergdoll, Philip Johnson Chief Curator of Architecture & Design, The Museum of Modern Art, New York, NY.
