HYP CUP 2013 - INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ARCHITECTURE COMPETITION The University of Tianjin's school of architecture and the Chinese press group Urban Environment Design (UED) are launching the second edition of their international competition on urban transformation, open to students of architecture from around the world. Competitors must offer a response to the provocative theme The Disappearance of Architecture. The idea is to remove ourselves from the architectural object and think about the real goals architecture should achieve. Students may choose the site on which to design their proposition, whose maximum built surface cannot exceed 4 000 m2. The deadline for registrations is 30 June 2013, and projects must be submitted by e-mail by 15 August 2013.

Cameron Sinclair co-founder of Architecture for Humanity

The American Institute of Architect's 2013 convention will take place in Denver, Colorado, on **20 - 22 June**, on the theme Building Leaders. Three important world figures will address the assembly: **Blake Mycoskie**, founder and chief shoe giver in the social venture TOMS shoes; **Cameron Sinclair**, co-founder of Architecture for Humanity, and **General Colin L. Powell**, former US Secretary of State. They will provide three models of leadership, an executive serving communities, an architecture working for the environment and humanity, and a politician serving his nation. It will be an opportunity for architects to reconsider their own role based on the speaker's uncommon experiences and engagements.

The UIA Bureau will also meet in Denver on 18 and 19 June, hosted by the AIA.

Architect Michael Graves was recently appointed by the American president to **lead the federal agency that treats issues of accessibility, the Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board**. Micheal Graves's works and realisations have earned him numerous prizes including the prestigious AIA Gold Medal in 2001. When confronted with his paralysis, he became determined to use his new perspective to improve accessibility in architecture and urban design. He stated upon nomination that "*Now, as a member of the Access Board, I expect to provide national leadership on accessible design, and hope I can contribute on a grand scale.*"


PETE BOSSLEY - GOLD MEDALLIST
