# On-going consultations

### Consultation on the Trade in Services Agreement (TiSA)

This public survey is about the negotiation and conclusion of a pluri-lateral agreement on trade in services between the EU and 21 WTO-members, namely Australia, Canada, Chile, Chinese Taipei, Colombia, Costa Rica, Hong Kong China, Iceland, Israel, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Panama, Paraguay, Pakistan, Peru, Switzerland, Turkey and the USA. ## Consultation on additional categories for a revised draft General Block Exemption Regulation on state aid measures ('GBER II')

The adoption by the Council of Ministers of the revision of Council Regulation (EC) No 994/98 in July 2013, creates the legal basis for future block exemptions in new categories, inter alia in innovation and in culture and heritage conservation. This public consultation addresses the compatibility criteria for those new categories. More information and the online consultation can be found on the Commission website. ### **Consultation on Sustainable Buildings**

The consultation asks citizens, businesses, NGOs and public authorities for ideas on how to reduce the impacts of the construction sector, make buildings more sustainable and create green opportunities for businesses. The European Commission wants to gather views and additional information on the possible introduction of EU wide measures to achieve better environmental performance of buildings.
