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The exhibition "Royal Influence on Interwar Architecture of Bucharest"

at the Bucharest National Opera

The Center of Excellence in Architecture, Arts and Audiovisual (C.E.A.A.A.) and its partners, together with the Romanian National Opera of Bucharest, the Peles National Museum, O.A.R. Bucharest, presents the exhibition project Royal Influence on Interwar Architecture of Bucharest", under the auspices of the Royal Family of Romania, an event realized and dedicated to the Centenary of King Mihai, the Centenary of the Romanian Opera and the 20th anniversary of the Romanian Order of Architects.

The exhibition highlights the cultural and historical identity, contributing to its integration into the European space. It will be open to the general public from October 21 to November 21, 2021, at the Bucharest National Opera. In 2017, 2018 and 2019, the exhibition was toured in Europe: Brussels - Belgium, Barcelona - Spain, Stockholm - Sweden, London - Great Britain, but also in Romania: at Suțu Palace - Bucharest Museum, at Pelisor Castle - Peles National Museum and at the Royal Palace - National Art Museum, National Museum of the Romanian Peasant.

The exhibition "Royal Influence on Interwar Architecture of Bucharest", signed by Dr. Luca Matei Stoian, has a complex content and of maximum interest to the general public and includes photo panels of modern architecture, buildings relevant to the modernist architecture of the capital during the interwar period. Bucharest is considered the Eastern European capital with the most numerous monuments of modernist architecture, a heritage built mostly in the interwar period.

"For the architecture of Bucharest, the fourth decade of the last century was one of modernity that no other capital in Eastern Europe has known. I would consider Luca Matei Stoian as my disciple, the representative of a young generation of extremely promising, very European architects, whom I discovered years ago, an admirable connoisseur of European architecture, especially the interwar one, to whom we owe the highlighting of the extraordinary Romanian interwar architecture, from the time of King Carol II in connection with Italy.



The architect Luca Matei Stoian managed to create an absolutely remarkable exhibition, opening absolutely outstanding horizons. It is a very good, well-made exhibition and the text and its photos reveal for us a whole world of modern Romanian architecture that we ignore without being aware that we have one of the best modern architectures in Europe. In fact, we owe this opening to Luca Matei Stoian, that it is important both for the history of architecture and for the entire history of Romanian culture."
